Texas Medicaid has Revised Developmental and Neurological Assessment and Testing Reimbursement

Information which was posted December 5, 2008: Effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2009, Texas Medicaid will implement revised reimbursement rates for developmental and neurological assessment and testing following a public rate hearing on November 17, 2008. Click on the title to view the details.

The following reimbursement rates for developmental and neurological assessment and testing are effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2009.

Medicaid Children's Loan Repayment Program

The Medicaid Children's Loan Repayment Program is available to physicians and dentists who provide services to children on Medicaid. For details, contact the Texas Primary Care Office at 512-458-7518 or TexasPCO@dshs.state.tx.us.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for student loan repayment through the Medicaid Children's Loan Repayment Program, the applicant must:

- Have a license from the appropriate licensing board before applying. Subspecialists must have board certification.
- Have a Medicaid number before applying.
- Have eligible outstanding student loans. This program does not reimburse for payments already made.
- Provide services for four continuous years and meet the appropriate target number of Medicaid visits to children under of the age of 21 as listed below for each 12-month service period.

Providers who do not meet the service requirements will be ineligible to apply for other Texas loan repayment programs.

Eligible Loans

To be eligible for repayment, a loan must:

- Have been made for undergraduate, graduate or medical education at an accredited institution in the United States. (Note: Loans made during residency are ineligible.)
- Not be from relatives or the provider's own insurance or pension plan.
- Not have an existing service obligation or be subject to another student loan repayment or forgiveness program.
- Not be consolidated with non-educational loans or loans held by another entity.
- Not be in default.

Repayments are paid annually upon completion of the eligible service, contingent upon availability of funds. The state is seeking a legal opinion on the taxability of loan repayment funds. Additional information will be provided as available.

Key Dates for First Application Cycle

March 1, 2009 Application released.

June 1, 2009 All parts of the application must be received for inclusion in this application cycle.

July 1–15, 2009 Selected applicants notified.

September 1, 2009 Beginning date for services to Medicaid children for Year 1 participants.

August 31, 2010 End date of 12-month service period for Year 1 participants.

October 2010 Year 1 Loan Repayment funds sent to lending agency.

How to Apply

Starting March 1, 2009, you may obtain an application at www.dshs.state.tx.us/chpr/default.shtm or by calling the Texas Primary Care Office at 512-458-7518. All parts of the application must be received by June 1, 2009, for consideration in the first review cycle.

2009 HEDIS Season is Upon Us

- As a Medicaid and CHIP HMO in the state of Texas, the quality of medical care delivered to Cook Children's Health Plan members is monitored by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission. We rely on a set of standard measures developed by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA). These measures are referred to as the "HEDIS" quality of care measures.
- Cook Children's Health Plan has contracted with **Austin Provider Solutions** to perform medical record reviews and abstractions for HEDIS 2009. Austin Provider Solutions may be in contact with your office during the months of March – May to either request that your office fax or mail pertinent medical record information to them -- or if we are requesting 8 or more records, to schedule an on-site visit to obtain the medical record(s).
- Be assured that the review of the record is permissible under applicable state and federal privacy laws and regulations, including those issued out of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), without requiring a separate consent by the patient or guardian.

EPSDT - TH Steps:

These are the elements that constitute a complete EPSDT/THSteps check up:

- Comprehensive health and development history
- Comprehensive unclothed physical
- Appropriate immunizations – using the Texas Vaccine for Children immunizations
- Lab tests (including lead blood level assessment appropriate for age and risk factors)
- Health education (including anticipatory guidance)
- Age-appropriate vision and hearing screening
- Direct referral to dental checkups beginning at 12 months of age

Please remember:

The Medical Transportation Program (MTP) provides categorically eligible Medicaid and Children with Special Health Care Needs (CSHCN) recipients with the most cost-effective means of transportation to appointments for their covered medical and dental care services within the reasonable proximity of their residence. Call MTP toll-free at 1-877-MEDTRIP (1-877-633-8747) during the normal business hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., weekdays at least two working days in advance of the trip.
